(Note: See the separate documents on the Club website *Resources* page - *Setting Bush Courses at the Correct Standard* and *Urban Series - Course Setter's Guide* to ensure your planned courses are at appropriate standard for the different navigational levels and properly set).

There are two options for planning orienteering courses - **OCAD** and **Purple Pen**. Purple Pen is a free program and is a bit simpler to use but has some limitations, while OCAD is a subscription product (the Club can provide course setters with an OCAD licence to use) but offers more flexibility and is the preferred file format for the final course file.

## Course Planning with OCAD

OCAD allows course planning with a background map file that is also in OCAD format (.ocd). The software is a Windows application but it is possible to run it on Mac or Linux. The club has licences for several editions of OCAD. The "OCAD Course Setting", "OCAD Starter" and full "OCAD Orienteering" editions all have the course setting functionality (there is also "OCAD Viewer" which is free to download but it only allows viewing and printing of maps and courses). The club's <u>mapping officer</u> (currently Geoff Todkill) can provide course planners with access to an "OCAD Course Setting" licence or an "OCAD Starter" licence ("OCAD Starter" also allows the user to do mapping updates).

IMPORTANT: You must use the correct and approved NOC *OCAD* planning template file to ensure the correct settings are used. There are separate templates for Bush, Urban/Sprint and MTBO course setting. The templates have the correct scale, control circle/control line specifications and the correct colour mix for overprinting. The correct template file can be obtained from the Club's <u>mapping officer</u>.

## Course Planning with Purple Pen

*Purple Pen* is a freeware program that provides an alternative to *OCAD* for planning orienteering courses. The software is a Windows application but it's possible to run it on Linux or Mac. The program is easy to use and can import both *OCAD* and *Open Orienteering Mapper* files as the background map.

IMPORTANT: You must use the approved, current NOC *Purple Pen* planning template file to ensure the correct settings are used. There are separate templates for Bush, Urban/Sprint and MTBO course setting. The templates have the correct scale, control circle/control line specifications and the correct colour mix for overprinting. The correct template file can be obtained from the Club's <u>mapping officer</u> (currently Geoff Todkill).

To learn the basics of course planning, after <u>downloading the PP program</u>, choose "*Purple Pen* Help" from the "Help" menu.

PURPLE PEN TIP: How to add a marked (taped) route in Purple Pen.

You can add a marked route for the beginning, end, or for the full route between controls. Select the line between controls on a course, then from the top drop down menu go "Item" then "Leg Flagging". If you add a bend to the line between controls (top drop down, bent purple line = "Add Bend") you can then add a marked route before or after the bend point ("Beginning of Leg Flagged"/"End of Leg Flagged").
